

Gillian was born in England and came to Australia as a child. She moved to Victoria, after graduating from Adelaide University, and worked in various educational roles. She's a keen traveller, cyclist and bushwalker. She's also created an environmentally-friendly house and garden with partner, Evan Gellert, and runs monthly world music concerts in Eltham for The Boîte.

After completing a Diploma of Professional Writing and Editing, Gillian taught Corporate Writing at CAE. She's won several awards for short stories, including the local section of the Alan Marshal Short Story Award. Her stories have been published in literary magazines and anthologies, including Award Winning Australian Writing and Best Australian Stories. Her

poems and non-fiction pieces have been published in newspapers and magazines. She's also edited books.



Tony Hatters was a participant in the first class. He continued, and now facilitates the class when Gillian is unavailable. Meeting through U3A proved serendipitous for both Gillian and Tony. Tony, a musician, was so taken with Gillian's poems, that he asked if he could adapt them into songs. Then he asked if she could sing them – the duo G&T was formed!

G&T have now completed their first CD, and are in the process of forming a band to launch it. They've been increasingly in demand, as a duo, after their first couple of live performances at U3A events. They're also working on a new CD, writing songs collaboratively and forging a firm friendship along the way. Whilst Gillian has been involved in music most of her life, singing solo and song-writing are new ventures for her. But that's what U3A's all about – expanding horizons with the support of fellow travellers.

New Rules of Association (previously know as Statement of Purposes or unofficially, as "The Constitution")

On 26 November 2012, the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (and its associated Regulations) replaced the Associations Incorporation Act 1981.

The Committee of Management has decided to adopt the new Model Rules, which must specify our name, our purpose and our financial year. These remain the same as in the old Statement of Purposes and are as follows:

- 1. The name of the incorporated association is Nillumbik U3A Inc.
- 2. The purposes for which the incorporated association is established are:
- (i) To provide low cost classes and activities which encourage continuing social and intellectual interaction for mature aged persons who are fully or partially retired.
- (ii) To operate as a community based learning co-operative which encourages voluntary participation in all aspects involved in the promotion of healthy ageing in a friendly and enjoyable atmosphere.
- (iii) To be a nonprofit community organization in which there is no distinction in terms of its membership between those who teach and those who learn.
- (iv) To ensure that learning is pursued without any reference to educational
- entry levels, qualifications, assessment or awards.
- (v) To liaise with other U3As and similar organizations both in Australia and overseas and exchange ideas and resources.
- (vi) To assist, where appropriate, investigations into the process of ageing, including the intellectual, cultural and aesthetic potentialities of older adults, as well as into the conditions and roles of the elderly in our community.
- 3. The financial year means the year ending 31st December.

New Classroom Equipment We are going to purchase a "document projector" which is a class aid for presenting to a room of participants such things as pages in a book, maps, newspaper articles, content on an iPad or smart phone, notes or diagrams that a tutor may make which can be saved and emailed to the class, showing an object (small or large: there is a zoom function). We feel that there will be plenty of uses and should enhance the class experience. We will be trialling it soon.

new classes for term 2

Asylum Seekers and Refugees - 6 weeks

Barbara Jackson Thursdays, 2.30-4pm at Nillumbik Health (917 Main Road Eltham)

The situation of asylum seekers and refugees wanting to settle in Australia is confronting our nation almost on a daily basis. Do we understand the issues? How can we decipher truth from spin? Why is this our problem when we are so far away from the more troubled areas of the world?

This course is designed for us to journey together to a greater understanding of the issues facing asylum seekers and refugees and what might be Australia's legitimate role. During the course you will be asked to do some research yourself and you will also meet asylum seekers and people that help them. By the end of the six weeks, we will evaluate our learnings together and attempt to draw some conclusions.

Cambodia – Its History and Development

Barbara Jackson Fridays, 10.30am -12.00pm, Old Eltham Courthouse, for 8 weeks

Cambodia is a popular tourist destination for many Australians. What lies behind the images of a gentle smiling people, the ancient civilisation of Angkor, the elegant pagodas, the peace of the countryside and the hectic pace of bustling Phnom Penh?

Through interactive discussion, learn about Cambodia – its history and culture, and the impact of Pol Pot's legacy on the daily lives of Cambodians and what modern Cambodia is like today.

The course is wide ranging with focus on its history as well as looking at aid and development. Both of these factors are inherent in trying to understand the dimensions of poverty faced by the majority of Cambodians

Participants will be encouraged to work together to gain a deeper understanding of Cambodia's general situation and issues faced by Cambodians.

Rethinking Australian Society

Brian Ellis, Wednesday , 10.30am – 12.00pm Old Eltham Courthouse - 8 weeks

The course is to be based on a draft manuscript by the Coordinator of about 20,000 words. The manuscript will be sent to all participants by email to provide a basis for discussion. All participants will be required to read this short monograph (a bit at a time), think about the issues, and come prepared to talk about them. The coordinator will introduce each session with a few remarks on the chapters or sections of chapters to be discussed.

Graphology

Maxine Bennett, Tuesdays, 11.30am-1pm Old Eltham Courthouse for 8 weeks

This course focuses on the analysis of handwriting and this will be practised during the sessions. Handwriting comes from the brain, is a true science, and not to be confused with fortune telling. It will show our true personality and cannot lie. Our strengths and

weaknesses (we all have them) will show up no matter how much we may try to disguise our writing. Our handwriting is exclusive to us and no-one can accurately copy it.

Metaphysics - Human and Planetary Processes Beverley Milne, Fridays 10.30am-12pm at Nillumbik Health (917 Main Rd Eltham)

This is a general metaphysics class to continue from term 2 to the end of the year. It would cover the nature and functions of the aura (mainly human) and chakras, energy movements and energy protection (preventing energy drainage), the major dimensions (planes) of a planetary system (our system anyway), evolution, and the law of karma and processes of incarnation and reincarnation in (mainly) human life and experience as we evolve. Notes provided. The course deals with Universal laws and processes, religious teachings discussed where of interest. Requirements: an open mind and notebook.

Astronomy and Cosmology

John O'Connor Tuesday 11.00 to 12.30 Bridges

Big History: Big Bang to Big Brain: our awesome cosmic pedigree.

Explore our night sky, deep space time. Einstein's relativity, quantum origins, parallel universes evolution of matter, galaxies, stars, planets, life, our brain and mind. Earth's history, climate, sustainability limits. Great visuals, updated course notes. Come enjoy and discuss.

Literature Meets Science

Diane Turner Thursday 3.00 to 4.30 Allwood House

The course will look at four imaginary societies through the creative lens of science fiction, or speculative literature. The novels we will study are Aldous Huxley's Brave New World, George Orwell's 1984, Ray Bradbury's Fahrenheit 451, and Margaret Atwood's The Handmaid's Tale. Could such societies ever exist, we may ask, and what parallels can we draw between them and our own? People interested in this course will need copies of these books (they are inexpensive to buy and easy to obtain) and be prepared to read them in manageable sections throughout the term.

Computers For Beginners

Tony Lee, Thursday 10-11.30am Nillumbik Health – 4 weeks

Let your fears go!.

This class is especially for beginners, and deals with Windows based Computers (PCs or Laptops). Objectives for students of this course are:-
