### **Aims and Strategies**

Explore some common idiomatic expressions as used in everyday French.

Grammar only as necessary and relevant.

From the text, preparing some work before the lesson, used in class too.

The construction of sentences in French to be studied.

Some phonetic work, as required.

Some memorising of dialogue, a little written work, some film/book review work + songs that are easy to sing or understand will be occasionally shared.

### **Texts**

1. "Colloquial French 2, The Next step in Language Learning" by Elspeth Broady (easy to access first of secondhand).

2. One grammar book is: Easy French Step-by-Step by Myrna Bell Rochester.

**Level of the group:** the below gives some guidance as to where most students start at:
